Our CSFII "Halftime" Score



Lions around the world have raised US\$59 million for CSFII. Approximately 18 months have passed since the launch of Campaign SightFirst II.

At this "halftime" in the campaign, look at your area's fund-raising progress. Now is the time to take action steps to assure your area meets its CSFII goal. The sight of millions tomorrow depends on the fund raising and service of Lions in your area today.

"Halftime" recommendations for your area:

- Lead by example by making a personal gift, becoming a Model Club or reaching your CSFII club goal early
- Follow up with clubs so funds already raised for CSFII are sent to LCIF as soon as possible
- Encourage group and district coordinators to visit clubs each month
- Remind your fellow Lions to designate their MJFs to CSFII

CSFII...By the Numbers

- **US\$59 million raised** toward our CSFII goal of US\$150 million
- **Less than 18 months** remaining to raise more than US\$91 million
- **1,395 Model Clubs** saving sight and changing lives

GC & DC Check-In News:

Communicating with your local CSFII team is critical to your area's success. It is always important to ask: **"What have your clubs raised this month for CSFII?"** Although monthly communication with your clubs is still recommended, the number of reporting dates scheduled has been decreased. Instead of monthly reports, the CSFII reporting schedule for the rest of this Lions year is now as follows:

- **February 26, 2007 - Worldwide Report Day #3:** Updated goals, known funds raised and clubs whose goals are "yet to be determined."
- **April 11 & April 16, 2007 - GC/DC Check-Ins:** Focus on clubs that have not yet submitted funds.
- **June 13, 2007 - Worldwide Report Day #4:** Total funds raised to date.

Check-In calls should answer three questions:

- *How much has been raised to date (but perhaps has not been sent in yet)?*
- *What are future fund-raising plans?*
- *Is any assistance required?*
